The 32nd annual Peach Bowl Reunion was held in Austell, GA on January 22nd.

about old times, visit with old friends and remember on of the most historic and important tracks in Georgia's rich racing history.

The legendary quarter-mile track was located at the corner of Brady Ave. and Howell Mill Road in Atlanta. Opened in 1949, featuring midget racing and

quickly became a haven for stock cars and super modifieds, known in the south at the times a "skeeters".

The track closed in 1971 and demolished the next year to make way for a MARTA bus repair depot.

But each year, those that remember the Peach Bowl get together to remem-

ber the speedway, the people and the great times they had at the corner of Brady and Howell Mill.
